Art for Guernsey unveils artworks by Damien Hirst

Art for Guernsey is delighted to announce that from 5 December a series of artworks by Damien Hirst will be unveiled for visitors to enjoy. "Conversations with Hirst" will be divided into three chapters, each displayed for 10-14 days throughout December and January.

Damien Hirst, born in Bristol in 1965, is a renowned British contemporary artist. Hirst's remarkable body of work spans multiple genres, media and materials, solidifying his position as one of the leading figures in the art world. He first came into the public eye when he co-curated the controversial Freeze exhibition in 1988, and swiftly rose to prominence as one of the influential Young British Artists (YBAs). Renowned for his thought-provoking approach, Hirst incorporates found materials and aims to evoke shock, exploring profound themes of life, death, and the very essence of art itself.

Art for Guernsey is grateful to Julius Baer Guernsey, whose generous sponsorship of the Julius Baer Strong Room gives students and the wider public the chance to see and study some of the unique pieces that are held privately on the island.

Conversations with Hirst will open to the public on Thursday 5 December, when from 6pm Art for Guernsey will host a free artist talk event by Patrick Earle, a locally based abstract artist. Patrick will share his insights into Hirst's body of work, exploring the techniques employed, the history and context of abstract expressionism, points of view relating to the controversy that often accompanies Hirst's work, and touching upon the question, what is art?

The Art for Guernsey Gallery is open from 10am-5pm Tuesday-Saturday, but on late-night shopping Thursdays - 5, 12 and 19 December - it will remain open until 9pm. Thursday 19 December will see the opening of the second chapter of the exhibition.



Jock Pettitt Curation Director of Art for Guernsey, said:

Our exhibitions are deeply rooted in Guernsey themes, focusing on the history, culture and the natural beauty of our islands through the lens of different artists and media. The Fabric of Guernsey exhibition exemplifies this and is a must-see for all in the community, showcasing the history and stories of the cherished garment. Conversations with Hirst is a different

opportunity, a chance to view works of art first hand, that would normally require travel, not focused on a Guernsey theme but made possible thanks to the generosity of the community. Damien Hirst is a very well-known figure in contemporary art, and seeing his sometimes controversial art in person can't help but stimulate conversation. With the insights being shared by Patrick Earle on the opening evening, providing some thoughtprovoking context, this is a great opportunity for those heading out for some late-night Christmas shopping, to add a little culture and conversation to the festive season.
